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Class Exemption for Commercial Fishing Vessels Under 36 Feet in Length Operating In the Fourteenth Coast Guard District

The Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2014 directs all Commercial Fishing Vessels operating beyond three nautical miles (NM) to complete a safety compliance examination and obtain a Commercial Fishing Vessel (CFV) Safety Decal or Certificate of Compliance by October 15, 2015. In accordance with Title 46 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 28.60, a class exemption from the requirements of 46 CFR 28 Subpart C¹ and the Survival Craft and Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB) requirements of 46 CFR 28 Subpart B has been approved by the U.S. Coast Guard Fourteenth District Commander and is hereby established for certain vessels. Applicability, equipment requirements, examination requirements, and recommendations are detailed below, and a checklist is enclosed. Good cause exists for granting this exemption, and the safety of qualifying vessels and those on board will not be adversely affected.

APPLICABILITY OF EXEMPTION:

- a. This exemption applies to U.S.-flagged CFVs that are:
 - less than 36 feet in length;
 - operate less than 15 NM from shore; and
 - operate with four or less people onboard.
- b. CFVs subject to this exemption operating more than 15 NM from shore must:
 - be accompanied by at least one other CFV in compliance with this class exemption;
 - · remain within line of sight of each other at all times; and
 - maintain radio communications with each other at all times.
- c. Unaccompanied vessels subject to this exemption that operate more than 15 NM from shore may lose the exemption granted herein.

ALTERNATE EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE EXEMPTION

a. In order to take advantage of the EPIRB and Survival Craft exemptions, each CFV must be equipped with a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) with internal GPS. The PLB must be securely attached to a personal flotation device (PFD) worn by the Captain or crew member; if attached to the inside pocket, the PFD must be clearly marked as containing a PLB and readily available at all times. In no instance may the PLB impede or interfere with the donning of the PFD.

¹ 46 CFR 28 Subpart C currently applies to documented vessels that operate beyond the boundary lines or with more than 16 people on board but will apply to all commercial fishing vessels fishing beyond three miles effective October 15, 2015.

- b. The PLB must be currently registered with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The registration must include the vessel's name and official number or HI state registration number of the CFV; proof of registration must be maintained on board at all times.
- c. The master or operator must conduct a safety orientation with crewmembers prior to each voyage, including the location and operation of the PLB.
- d. Each vessel must maintain on-board, operable radio equipment capable of communicating with shore stations or with other vessels in the vicinity. This radio must be tested prior to each voyage.

EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS

- a. Each CFV must successfully complete a Coast Guard Dockside examination and receive a CFV Safety Decal or Certificate of Compliance every two years.
- b. Each CFV must comply with all safety requirements set forth in 46 CFR Part 28, Subpart B, and the emergency instructions, training, and drill requirements found in 46 CFR 28.265 and 46 CFR 28.270, respectively, as indicated in enclosure.
- c. Coast Guard dockside examiners will issue this Marine Safety Information Bulletin (MSIB) D14-01-15 to each qualifying CFV that completes a dockside exam. Each CFV must carry this MSIB or a legible copy on board at all times and make it available to Coast Guard personnel upon request.

OPERATIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS

a. Each CFV should file a voyage plan with a family member or other responsible party in advance of every trip.

This class exemption will be evaluated annually by the Fourteenth District CFV Safety Coordinator to ensure there are no adverse impacts on the safety of the fleet, and the exemption furthers the intent of increasing compliance with fishing vessel safety regulations. If it is determined that the exemption is not meeting this intent or that safety has been compromised, the exemption will be cancelled or modified.
