HOW DID WE GET HERE?

- Believed that a long standing misinterpretation of the term "part-time tender" and applicable exemption from the inspection requirements of 46USC3302 as a result of HR7230, June 1984
- Increase in the number of vessels solely tendering after crab rationalization brought this "on the radar"
- Applicability questions as a result of certain casualty/fatality investigations

PART TIME TENDERS H7230 June 27, 1984

- H7230 amended Section 3302 of 46 USC to permanently exempt fishing, fish processing and fish tender vessels from inspection as a freight, seagoing motor vessel, fish processor or fish tender
- The exemption included those fishing vessels that are chartered part-time as fish tender vessels
- This language MAY have led to an early interpretation that these Part-time tenders were exempt from load line also?

FISH PROCESSINGUSE DEFINITIONS.

DEFINITIONS/REFERENCES

- "Fishing Vessel" 46 USC 2101(11a)
 - A vessel that commercially engages in the catching, taking or harvesting of fish or an activity that can reasonably be expected to result in the catching, taking or harvesting of fish
- "Fish Tender Vessel" 46 USC 2101(11c)
 - A vessel that commercially supplies, stores, refrigerates or transports fish, fish products or materials directly related to fishing or the preparation of fish to or from a fishing, fish processing, or fish tender vessel or a fish processing facility
- "Existing Vessel" 46 USC 5101(3)
 - A vessel on a domestic voyage, the keel of which was laid, or at a similar stage of construction, before Jan 1, 1986; and
 - ★ A vessel on a foreign voyage, the keel of which was laid, or that was at a similar stage of construction, before Jul 21, 1968 (no applicability here)

WHO DOESN'T NEED A LOAD LINE?

- 46 USC 5102(b)(3) A Fishing Vessel, unless the vessel is built after July 1, 2013
- 46 USC 5102(b)5 A fish tender vessel of not more than 500 gross tons as measured under section 14502 of this title, or an alternate tonnage measured under section 14302 of this title as prescribed by the Secretary under section 14104 of this title that— (A) (i) was constructed, under construction, or under contract to be constructed as a fish tender vessel before January 1, 1980; or
- (ii) was converted for use as a fish tender vessel before January 1, 1983; and
- (B) (i) is not on a foreign voyage; or
- (ii) is not engaged in the Aleutian trade (except a vessel in that trade assigned a load line at any time before June 1, 1992).
- (6) a vessel of the United States on a domestic voyage that does not cross the Boundary Line, except a voyage on the Great Lakes.

WHO DOESN'T NEED A LOAD LINE (cont'd)

- (7) a vessel of less than 24 meters (79 feet) overall in length.
- (8) a public vessel of the United States on a domestic voyage.
- (9) a vessel excluded from the application of this chapter by an international agreement to which the United States Government is a party.
- (10) an existing vessel of not more than 150 gross tons as measured under section 14502 of this title, or an alternate tonnage measured under section 14302 of this title as prescribed by the Secretary under section 14104 of this title that is on a domestic voyage.
- (11) a small passenger vessel on a domestic voyage.
- (12) a vessel of the working fleet of the Panama Canal Commission not on a foreign voyage.
- (13) a vessel of the United States on a domestic voyage that is within the Gulf of Mexico and operating not more than 15 nautical miles seaward of the base line from which the territorial sea of the United States is measured between Crystal Bay, Florida and Hudson Creek, Florida.


- ADFG/CFEC data used almost exclusively to determine tendering history

- Will need industry input to achieve accuracy


